- **INDEX #1** - Amendment to the Region Bylaws, Article V Elections, Section 5.2. Voting shall be by ballot. The GWR Governor shall appoint tellers, who are not delegates, to oversee the election and count the ballots. The credential and elections committee shall insure that each delegate has been properly designated as a delegate by her club, and that her name badge identifies her as being entitled to vote. (Election of district officers shall be by delegates from that district only).
 - **INDEX #2** - Amendment to the Region Bylaws, Article V, Elections, Section 5.2. The new officers shall be installed at the GWR conference and will assume office on July 1 of even-numbered years.
 - **INDEX #3** - Amendment to the Region Bylaws, Article IX, Finance, Section 9.5, Control of Funds. The GWR Treasurer shall maintain a reserve account funded in the following manner: at the end of the fiscal year, 100% of the surplus revenue in the general fund shall go into the reserve account until a total amount of \$20,000 or one years' operating budget is reached, whichever is greater. Thereafter, additional surplus funds shall be allocated as follows:
 - a. 60% to the service fund
 - b. 40% to the general fund to be used in addition to the current operating expense budget.
 The net income from GWR service project shall go to the service fund.
 - INDEX #4** - Amendment to the Region Bylaws, Article IX, Finance, Section 9.2, Dues and Fees.
 - a. Member Dues
 - 1. For Clubs in existence as of July 1, the dues of the GWR shall be \$20.00 per member, per year. Exception: Life members. Dues are computed on membership as of July 1 and are due and payable to the GWR Treasurer within (ten) 10 days. Club dues are delinquent July 10. Delinquent clubs are subject to the provision of Article IX, Dues and Fees, Section 9.2-e.
 - 2. New members joining a club on or after January 1 through June 30 shall be assessed prorated dues of \$10.00.
 - b. Charter Member Dues: Charter member dues shall be paid to the GWR as follows:
 - 1. Clubs chartered July 1 through December 31: \$20.00 per member
 - 2. Clubs chartered January 1 through June 30: \$10.00 per member

2014 SIA GOVERNOR'S ROUND TABLE/REGION CHAIR TRAINING

Incoming GWR Governor Sandi Cvercko attended 2014 Governor's Round Table held just after the 42nd Annual SIA Biennial Convention in Vancouver Canada. The SIA staff introduced tools from the SIA website to help clubs realize the new direction of Shaping the Future and entering into a culture of philanthropy within their own organization. The tools could be used as a way of assessing the collective impact of their own club. The Governors were given a new hand out piece for the clubs called "Club Roadmap for Success" that outlined goals in each pillar area as a guide to clubs unsure what the new programs meant. The Governors were also introduced to a format called a "Guidelines for a Healthy Region" to help assess the strength of the Region and its relationship to the clubs.

42nd BIENNIAL CONVENTION OF SOROPTIMIST INTERNATIONAL OF THE AMERICAS, Inc.

Golden West Region Soroptimist were among the many Soroptimist members, friends and guests to attend the 42nd Biennial Convention held this year in Vancouver Canada. There were many changes introduced at the general sessions including the renaming of the Women's Opportunity Award. The new name is Live Your Dream Award, which is thought to more effectively communicate the intention of the award. The new girl program was also introduced. "Dream It, Be It" was rolled out. DIBI is an event for high school girls rather than an award as Violet Richardson was. The curriculum is being developed and will be available on the SIA website early in 2015. There was also much discussion regard raising the SIA dues over the next several years, and putting the dues raises in the future in the hands of the SIA Board of Directors. Both items passed the vote at convention and would be sent to the clubs for a final vote. The Golden West Region was recognized for 100% participation in the Live Your Dreams Award.

2015 SIA GOVERNOR'S ROUND TABLE/REGION CHAIR TRAINING

The 2015 Governors Round Table was held June 12-13, 2015 at the Crowne Plaza International Airport Hotel in Los Angeles, California. Governor Sandi Cvercko and Governor-elect Penny Babb attended. Realizing that membership is an ongoing concern of all clubs, a new program was introduced by SIA called "All Aboard the MemberSHIP" Using a nautical theme promotional pieces were distributed and discussed. The Governors were encouraged to promote the program and let the clubs know there would be awards given by SIA. The discussion was begun regarding our Next Big Goal. We talked about what that goal might be and how to define it. The impact of the membership classification change was considered a success as it frees the clubs to invite anyone they choose to join.
