MAY 15, 2017 INTERNATIONAL DAY OF FAMILIES



2017 THEME "Families, Education and Well Being"

This year's observance of the International Day of Families focuses on the role of families and family-oriented policies in promoting education and overall well being of their members. In particular, the day is to raise awareness of the role of families in promoting early childhood education and lifelong learning opportunities for children and youth.

The day will highlight the importance of all caregivers in families, be it parents, grandparents or siblings, and the importance of parental education for the welfare of children. It will focus on good practices for work family balance to assist parents their educational caregiving roles. Good practices from the private sector in support of working parents, as well as youth and older persons in the workplace will also highlighted.

The day also aims to discuss the importance of knowledge and skills needed to promote sustainable development, including among others, through

education for sustainable development and sustainable lifestyles, human rights, gender equality, promotion of a culture of peace and non-violence, global citizenship and appreciation of cultural diversity and of culture's contribution to sustainable development. (SDG4, target 4.7).

WHERE WE STAND: AGING

Soroptimist International calls immediate attention to the growing population of older women and denounces the tendency for women beyond reproductive age to be invisible not just from policies and programs, but from society as a whole. Women have often experienced a lifetime of discrimination which culminates in a multitude of challenges faced in the post reproductive years, including a lack of security, protection, access to resources, access to education and access to health care. Soroptimist International life course champions a approach of educating, and enabling empowering opportunities for women at all ages, including the specific needs of older women.

SOROPTIMIST INTERNATIONAL URGES GOVERNMENTS TO...

Ratify, implement without reservations and monitor all

international treaties and agreements relating to older women, particularly the Madrid International Plan of Action on Aging, and take into consideration CEDAW's General Recommendation 27 on Women and Aging.

Adopt the World Health Organization's recommended three pillar approach of ensuring older women have nondiscriminatory access to participation, health and security.

Address with immediate effect any laws or practices which render women financially insecure in older age, including differential retirement ages, lack of policies which allow women to fulfil dual roles as caregivers and employees and approaches to pensions which favor men.

Enact and enforce legislation which eliminates all forms of violence against older women, including physical, psychological, emotional, verbal, financial abuse and exploitation and neglect.

Roll out and adequately fund services aimed at reducing isolation and lack of social support specifically for older women.

Remove all barriers to older women's access to credit, financial and other productive resources, property and inheritance, particularly for widows and unmarried older women.

Sensitize and train authorities on age and gender related issues that affect older women.

Collect data and evidence based research disaggregated by age and sex to better understand the unique needs of older women.

SOROPTIMIST INTERNATIONAL WILL CONTINUE TO...

Support programs and agencies which provide services for older

women, including health care, social care, independence and recovering from abuse.

Ensure that older women are supported to actively participate in society.

Champion a life course approach to access to education, training and technology.

Lobby governments to ensure that social protection measures are in place for older women.

Work towards changing gender stereotypes of older women, particularly the negative portrayal of older women in the media.

Encourage health care professionals to screen for elder abuse of older women.

Recognize and support the unique role many older women play as primary caregivers for AIDS orphans and grandchildren.

SOROPTIMIST INTERNATIONAL...

Provides educational opportunities for older women, including literacy and maths, vocational skills, technological skills and knowledge about their rights.

Empowers older women to actively participate in society and to take control over their own lives.

Enables opportunities for older women to continue to live their lives to their fullest potential throughout their entire lives, not just in their societal defined productive and reproductive years.

Our 2017 Salute to Service Luncheon was a great success! We had some amazing women and girls that we honored who have spent countless hours of volunteering within our community.

We had three **STUDENT VOLUNTEER AWARDS** handed
out with one girl receiving
\$1,500 and the other two girls
received \$500 each. Two of the

girls were from North High School (Lizette Garcia and Rocio Robles) and one was from Ramona High School (Wendy Osorio). All three girls will be entering college in the Fall...two of them expressed an interest in the medical field and one is interested working in a non-profit area where she can make a difference in the world.

LIVE YOUR Our DREAM: EDUCATION AND TRAINING AWARD was given to Natasha Maness. Natasha is expecting to graduate in June with her B.A. degree from California State University, San Bernardino after nine years of study. She supports her three children with a full-time job at the Department of Affairs. Veterans ln her application, Natasha said, "I was in a very abusive relationship both mentally and physically with mv now ex-husband. I knew I had to go to college so I could provide a better future for my kids. He hated the fact that I enrolled into college, and I recall him breaking my laptop and completely destroying my school supplies in a jealous frenzy." Natasha has been accepted into the Masters Program at CSUSB and plans to become a social worker.

Our GOLD KEY AWARD was given to Annetti Bullock. This year we selected the Riverside Police Department for this award and they nominated Annetti. She has volunteered for the RPD for nine years and put in over 1700 hours! Annetti coordinated the "You Are Not Alone Program." She daily contacts senior citizens to see how they are doing and tracking their needs. She also serves as a Chaplain with the department providing comfort and strength to both the department members and community members when traaedv strikes. On nomination paper, RPD said, "Anytime there is a need, she will drop what she is doing to answer the call for assistance. Ms. Bullock goes above and beyond

to help not only the Police Department, but also her community."

Our Salute to Service Luncheon allows us to directly make a difference in women and girls' lives. Our hard earned Valentine Dessert Auction dollars allow us to support women and girls who are volunteering and moving ahead within our community. I'm so proud to be a member of SI Riverside!

This may not be Austria, but the hills were indeed alive this weekend with the sound of music. The city of Riverside was blessed to have visitors from Erlangen, Germany, the Stad'l Harmonists, nine men who sing in the barbershop style.

They performed in the Sister City Concert on Saturday at the Magnolia Center Church of Christ with our local Inland Sound Chorus, a group of over two dozen men who also sing in the barbershop style. In fact, a quartet from this group sang at our SIR installation three years ago when I was installed as president, and my theme was "Hands in Harmony". Roberts was the installing officer and she went to work finding just the right addition to the evening, and a connection was made.

Last September, when Karin, Jeanne and I were in Erlangen for the three countries gathering we met with two members of the Harmonists to continue to arrange their visit to California. The concert location had already been chosen and there were several items on their agenda that needed coordination.

Karin was instrumental in setting up a visit for the men and their wives to the Desert Memorial Park in Cathedral City where they were able to pay their respects to one of the greatest German Harmonists from the 1930's, Josef R. Cycowski. On Sunday they all walked Mt. Rubidoux with our mayor, Rusty Bailey, and then

we had the pleasure of hosting their group along with some of Inland Sound Chorus gentlemen and their wives and members of the International Relations Council at our house. We were treated to several songs in a cozy backyard setting. Some were in German and some in English, and the ISC men joined in for those numbers. We were delighted to receive several gifts from the Stad'l Harmonists and they were kind enough to donate their portion of the proceeds from the Saturday event to our club.

Many thanks to the SI Riverside members who helped set up and clean up and who brought food to share: Karin Roberts, Jeanne Hatcher, Chris Deviny, Carolyn Kegarice, Glenda Richards, Ellen Clizbe, Linda Robertson and Colleen Walker. THE SOROPTIMIST EMBLEM

The emblem is a circular disc on which the figure of a woman appears as the central figure. She emerges as the "spirit of womanhood," vital, steadfast and dauntless. A plaque bearing the name "Soroptimist" is held in her upraised arms.

The leaves and acorns of the oak bend downward to the right from the word "Soroptimist" and are emblematic not only of the strength and growth of the organization but of the progress and achievements that it will attain. The leaves of the laurel are on the left of the word "Soroptimist." Laurel is renowned

as the symbol of victory and typifies friendship and success, both of which are vital to club life.

The word "International" forms the lower portion of the emblem and signifies the worldwide institution that Soroptimist has become.

Our emblem is more than just a badge of identification. It is a symbol of the aims and ideals of Soroptimists everywhere.

BETTY BENNETT May 5, 1925 - March 26, 2017

Betty Bennett was SI Riverside's president from 1971-72. Her Soroptimist legacy includes the creation of the club's Gold Key Award presented for the first time in 1972 to a woman who had given 20 years of volunteer service to the local community.

The Gold Key Award program was such an astounding success that we call it SI Riverside's most prestigious award and have continued to present it to a deserving woman every year since 1972.

Betty retired and left the club in 1990 at which time SI Riverside presented her with an Honorary Membership. Even after she retired, Betty supported many of our club events with personal donations and she loved reading the club newsletter which was emailed to her every month.
