

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Soroptimist is a global women's organization whose members volunteer to improve the lives of women and girls through programs leading to social and economic empowerment. The organization is particularly concerned with providing women and girls access to education, as this is the most effective path to self-determination. Soroptimist, means "best for women."

Soroptimist International (SI), is headquartered in Cambridge, England. SI is composed of four federations:

- Soroptimist International of the Americas (SIA), headquartered in Philadelphia, PA, comprises 28 regions with about 30,000 members in approximately 1,290 clubs in 20 countries.
- SI of Europe, headquartered in Geneva, Switzerland, with about 34,000 members in 1,250 clubs in 61 countries.
- SI of Great Britain & Ireland, headquartered in Cheshire, England, with about 7,900 members in 340 clubs in 29 countries.
- SI of the South West Pacific, headquartered in Sydney, Australia, with about 2,500 members in 140 clubs in 13 countries.

One of the 28 Regions of SIA, our own Golden West Region (GWR), provides administrative support to clubs within its territorial limits, which include San Bernardino and Riverside Counties of California, the State of Arizona (except Yuma County), the State of New Mexico, and El Paso County in Texas. GWR has 45 clubs and over 1,000 members who work to improve the lives of women and girls.

Thank you all SI M/IV's current members and our newest member for submitting dues payment. Here is some interesting information regarding Live Your Dream (LYD) Award Program, showing our collective impact:

The LYD Program involves three levels of cash awards. The program begins at the local Soroptimist club level, where award amounts vary. Local level award recipients become eligible for region level awards of either \$3,000 or \$5,000. Region level award recipients then become eligible to receive one of three international-level awards of \$10,000.

Since the Program began in 1972, about \$30 million in education grants have been disbursed to assist tens of thousands of women achieve their dreams of a better life for themselves and their families.
