#### The Multiple Documents You Need Before You Die

It isn't enough to simply sign a bunch of papers creating an estate plan and other end-of-life instructions. You also need to make your heirs aware of them, and where to find them. Consider this: At least 10 states, including California, have been investigating some of the country's largest insurance companies for failing to pay out unclaimed life insurance proceeds to beneficiaries. Insurers say they're behaving lawfully since it's not their responsibility to determine if a policy holder is still alive.

According to the National Association of Unclaimed Property Administrators, state treasurers currently hold about \$33 billion in unclaimed bank accounts and other assets. Check out the

Losing a loved one is hard enough without the struggle to wade through the late person's financial life, so here's a list of essential documents that should be kept together and in a place that the heirs know about:

- ❖ Original Will or Trust----To avoid the time and expense of probate, consider a revocable living trust.
- ❖ Proof of Ownership—You should keep documentation of real estate ownership, cemetery plots, vehicles, stock certificates and savings bonds; any partnership or corporate operating agreements; and a list of brokerage and escrow mortgage accounts.

Keeping recent copies of tax returns is valuable too, since it offers a snapshot of what assets are owned.

- ❖ Bank Accounts—Keep a list of all accounts including log-in information. Also, list any safety deposit boxes and register your spouse or child's name with the bank so they can access them.
- ❖ Health-Care Confidential—Make sure that you have a durable health care Power of Attorney form. This allows someone to make health care decisions on your behalf if you're incapacitated.
- Life Insurance and Retirement Accounts—Copies of life insurance policies will help your family know the policy number, carrier, and agent to contact.
- ❖ Marriage and Divorce—Make sure to keep a copy of your marriage license and your divorce decree if applicable.

#### CRANBERRY/ORANGE/WHITE CHOCOLATE COOKIES



½ C butter, softened
½ C packed brown sugar
½ C sugar
1 egg
1 tsp orange extract

1 ½ C all-purpose flour
½ tsp baking soda
1 tsp ground ginger
1 tsp dried cranberries
6 oz white chocolate chips

Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Combine sugar and butter until smooth. Add egg and orange and beat until smooth. Separately combine: flour, baking soda and ginger. Mix into sugar mixture in small portions. Mix in cranberries and white chocolate chips. Drop spoonful of batter onto baking sheet (I like to line with parchment). Bake for 8 to 10 minutes. Let cookies cool for at least 5 minutes.

Take it one step further! Combine/mix 4 oz cream cheese, 2 C powdered sugar, 2 tsp orange extract and ½ tsp vanilla extract. May be put in a plastic bag and then cut small hole in the tip of bag with scissors to pipe a decoration onto the cookies for extra decadence!
