

CRANBERRY PISTACHIO BISCOTTI

-President Betsy

1 % C flour

1 C sugar

½ tsp baking powder

¼ tsp salt

4 tbsp butter, 1/2" cubes

1 tsp vanilla extract

½ C dried cranberries

1 ½ C shelled, unsalted pistachios

2 eggs



Preheat over to 350 degrees and butter baking sheet

Combine flour, sugar, baking powder and salt in a large bowl. I like to mix by hand, wearing gloves. Add vanilla and mix. Mix in cranberries and pistachios. Add eggs and mix until dough is evenly moistened. Scrape down the sides of the bowl.

On a lightly floured surface –wearing gloves-- mold and shape dough into four logs about 8 inches long. Place the logs about 2 inches apart on the prepared baking sheet. With hands, flatten logs to a width of two inches and sprinkle tops of logs with extra sugar.

Bake logs in the middle of the oven until golden brown, about 25 minutes. Remove from oven and let cool, about another 25 minutes.

Transfer logs to cutting board. Using a sharp knife, cut logs into ½" slices. Put slices back onto baking sheet and bake in oven for 7 minutes more. Remove and cool.

FAREWELL 2018 AND "HELLO 2019!"





Wow, I am just finishing up my fifth year of working for myself. Why did I not do this 20 years ago? Some days I wish the phone would stop ringing, then other days I hear the words that keep me going, "Thank you Susan." Desert Cities Indoor Air is keeping me busy and paying the bills. I just finished a year serving as Chair of the Quorum Committee for the Coachella Valley Community Association Institute. "Quorum" is a monthly, 40-page glossy magazine printed and sent to nearly 1,000 community managers, business partners and homeowner boards in our valley. A lot of work for a volunteer group.

In January, we traveled south of the Border Fence to Mexicali with Jess' Rotary club, bringing with us five pickup truckloads of toys, clothing, food and writing supplies to children living in poverty. It was Kings Day, a feast day where special cakes are eaten.

I was in charge of pouring the milk (leche). They were so happy when they got seconds. One child asked us if

we get to eat every day in America. Makes you so grateful for being born in the USA. No wonder everyone wants to come here.

After that experience, we decided we wanted to do more for our neighbors to the south by spending some more of our dollars in Nuevo Vallarta, a new resort area just to the north of Puerto Vallarta,



where they made the famous movie, "Night of the Iguana". We highly recommend you check out the hotels

there. Southwest Airlines now flies direct from San Diego and it is only a two hour flight. We had a lovely three bedroom suite with two patios overlooking the pool and ocean for a very reasonable price.



We returned to Kauai again in July but this time added on 5 nights on the Kohala Coast on the Big Island, far away from the lava flow and the active volcano. We visited a vanilla bean farm and learned to add a few splashes of real vanilla extract to our seafood dishes. Yummy. The most exciting Raider news of the year started in January with the announcement that Jon Gruden was returning to coach our team. We cried tears of joy. Then we had the opportunity to visit the Las Vegas Raider



Stadium preview center on the Las Vegas strip. Unfortunately, we could not afford the Personal Seat License for the first and best seats that went on sale, but we waited a few months and were able to secure similar seats to what we have had in Oakland, third tier up around the 50 yard line, but with a view of the strip. The new stadium will have the modern amenities: escalators, WiFi, bars and working bathrooms. Oh Boy! We can hardly wait for 2020.

We had been looking at river cruises in Ireland when I received an email from our local university about an Adriatic Sea cruise to Croatia in November 2019. The price including airfare for two weeks was too good to pass up.

We checked our passports and put down a deposit. The ship has only 25 cabins. We fly into Zagreb, the capital of Croatia. The ports of call sound so exotic: Split, Hvar, Dubrovnik, Kotor, and more. We even stop in Bosnia, Herzegovina and Montenegro. We promise lots of pictures.

2018 was a great year and 2019 has a promising outlook. Looking forward to another great Soroptimist year together!
