The ultimate goal is to continue to add new members which goes a long way to improving our resources. It just makes good dollars and "sense."

The San Bernardino club has supported Federation projects for many, many years. Some have been called by other names, but they still are a major focus for the members.

Currently, the Live Your Dream program is nearing its final stages to select club winners who go on to compete at Region level. Feeration finalists are then featured in the Federation magazine, *Best For Women*. Chairperson, Judy, will be announcing the club's winner very soon.
