

- ✓ **Read Across America Day** is held annually on a school day closest to March 2 each year. The day promotes reading for children. History--The National Education Association in 1997 moved to create a day to celebrate reading in the U.S. In 1998 the day became an official observance in the U.S. encouraging reading among our youth. March 2 was selected as the date for this observance because it is the birth date of Dr Seuss who wrote many famous kids books. Read Across America Day is not a national holiday but rather an observance.
- ✓ **National Women's History Month--**every year March is designated Women's History Month by Presidential proclamation. The month is set aside to honor women's contributions in American history. Women's History Month began as a local celebration in Santa Rosa, CA. The Education Task Force of the Sonoma County (CA) Commission on the Status of Women planned and executed a "Women's History Week" celebration in 1978. The organizers selected the week of March 8 to correspond with International Women's Day. The movement spread across the country as other communities initiated their own Women's History Week celebrations the following year. In 1980, a consortium of women's groups and historians-led by the National Women's History Proiect (now the National Women's History Alliance)—successfully lobbied for national recognition. In February 1980, President Jimmy Carter issued the first Presidential Proclamation declaring the Week of March 8 as National Women's History Week. Subsequent Presidents continued to proclaim a National Women's History Week in March until 1987 when Congress passed Public Law 100-9, designating March as "Women's History Month." Between 1988 and 1994, Congress passed additional resolutions requesting and authorizing the President to proclaim March of each year as Women's History Month. Since 1995, each president has issued an annual proclamations designating the month of March as "Women's History Month." The National Women's History Alliance selects and publishes the yearly theme.
