

APPROVES NEW SOROPTIMIST FEDERATION

At the Soroptimist International (SI) Board Meeting, immediately preceding the (July 19-21) 21st SI Convention in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, the creation of a new Africa Federation was approved.

This will be the fifth Federation of Soroptimist International, and is a great step forward. Currently, African Nations are either part of Soroptimist International Europe or Soroptimist International Great Britain & Ireland. This will unite the Soroptimist clubs within Africa.

The Charter of the new Federation is planned for the African biennial conference in April 2020 on the Ivory Coast.

SI Great Britain & Ireland (SIGBI) is delighted to congratulate the Future African Federation Task Force on this success and looks forward to offering support to ensure the transition goes smoothly.
