

On July 4, 1776, the Continental Congress formally adopted the Declaration of Independence, which had been written largely by Jefferson. Though the vote for actual independence took place on July 2, from then on the 4th became the day that was celebrated as the birth of American independence. The 56 signers of the Declaration of Independence did not sign at the same time, nor did they sign on July 4, 1776. The official event occurred on August 2, 1776, when 50 men signed. Others signed in following weeks.

Both Thomas Jefferson and John Adams died on Independence Day, July 4, 1826.

We have heard from several of you about the death of George Floyd and the subsequent protests seeking racial justice. We join with the rest of the world in mourning the injustices faced by people of color.

We've been asked about SIA's official response, and how clubs should respond. As you know, we are a non-political organization. Rightly or wrongly, George Floyd's death and the protests have become politicized.

Emotions are high right now, and it may be hard to keep personal opinions to ourselves. But in service to our non-political stance, we ask that clubs refrain from releasing personal statements under the SIA banner. We have issued the official statement below and ask that our clubs use it.

We applaud the heartfelt concern of our members as we all work together to create a more just world. Thank you for your support and cooperation, and please contact sihg@soroptimist.org with any questions or concerns.

SIA Statement

For almost 100 years, Soroptimist has worked to create a better world for women and girls. Diversity and Fellowship is one of the core values that drives our work, and we model it in our membership, the women and girls we serve, and our hiring practices. It pains us to see racial injustice and violence of any kind. While we are living through confusing times right now, where consensus is often hard to find, we remain committed to working for a more just and equal world. We urge introspection and collaboration on ways we can work together to fix systems that do not serve all of us equally. We know that many of the women and girls we serve face inequality because of their race or ethnicity, as well as their gender. We will continue to do our part and contribute positively to our communities, nations and the world by helping women and girls to reach their full potential by getting the education they need to achieve economic empowerment.

Right now, we urge calm, empathy and kindness. In the words of Abraham Lincoln, "We are not enemies, but friends. We must not be enemies. Though passion may have strained, it must not break our bonds of affection. The mystic chords of memory will swell when again touched, as surely they will be, by the better angels of our nature."

DISNEYLAND IS 65 YEARS OLD !!

Disneyland, the first of two theme parks built at the Disneyland Resort in Anaheim, CA, opened on July 17, 1955. It is the only theme park designed and built to completion under the direct supervision of Walt Disney.

Walt Disney came up with the concept of Disneyland after visiting various amusement parks with his daughters in the 1930s and 1940s. He initially envisioned building a tourist attraction adjacent to his studios in Burbank to entertain fans who wished to visit. He soon realized that the proposed site was too small. After hiring a consultant to help him determine an appropriate site for his project, Disney bought a 160-acre site near Anaheim in 1953. Construction began in 1954 and the park was unveiled during a special televised press event on the ABC Television Network on July 17, 1955. Opened in 2001, Disney California Adventure was built on the site of Disneyland's original parking lot.

Currently the Disneyland Resort has been closed since March 14 for the third time in history in response to the coronavirus pandemic. Up until now, Disneyland has only closed unexpectedly 3 times: Nov. 23, 1963--National Day of Mourning for President John Kennedy; Jan. 17, 1994--the Northridge earthquake; and September 11, 2001. At press time, Disneyland and Disney California Adventure are scheduled to re-open on July 17..... it's **65th Birthday**!!
